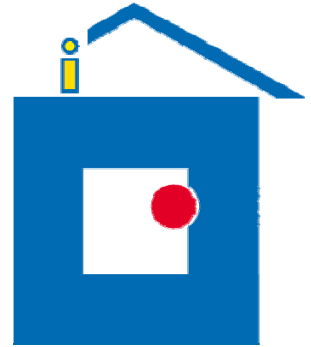

Prizes will be awarded to:

Application-specific solutions and services which enhance indoor air quality:

Product developments in the indoor air quality field which verifiably avoid or reduce the appearance of interior pollution load e. g. building materials with catalytic activity or technical improvement/ optimisation of cleaning/ filtering and maintenance of equipment.
First-time or exemplary application of individualised techniques and procedures.
Innovative services that conduce to reduction of interior contaminant.
Exemplary planning and construction-attendance to improve indoor air quality.

In 2011 the working committee for indoor air quality, composed of a variety of industry experts, advertises the European indoor air quality award for the first time.

What does the award aim for?

The award is meant as a funding and an appreciation of outstanding enterprising and technological performances in the indoor air quality field in Europe.

Prize money

The prize money amounts to 5.000 €

The prize money may be split to several laureates.

Jury

The awarding decision is made by a competent jury, consisting of members of the working committee for indoor air quality. The jury's judgement is non-appealable.

Commendable communication with clients and in public:

The sustainable support of living health and indoor air quality by extraordinary conceptions or initiatives, e. g. in customer contact or in advertising.

Advice purposing the sensitisation of customers for sustainable purchase decisions and the increase of market share of indoor air quality products and services.

Criteria:

The competition entries will be judged by the following criteria:

Relevance of indoor air quality in living and working premises;
innovational level of products, services and planning efficiency;
integrated solutions and cross-industry processes and networks.

The entire competition papers must be received by the working committee for indoor air quality by October 1st, 2010 at the latest.

The official prize giving ceremony is taking place on February 15th, 2011 within a special event during the 3rd German forum of indoor air quality.
